"Balance", according to my dictionary, implies "equal weight or power".

I keep wondering why anyone would want to have a "balanced" scorecard, given

the real meaning of this term, since all aspects of performance are clearly

not of equal weight, nor all indicators of performance of equal power.

So why do people keep talking about the desirability of having a "balanced

scorecard"? It really puzzles me.

The answer, I guess, lies in the fact that "balance" is one of the few words

in the English language – rather like "motherhood" – to which people seem

instinctively to warm.

Who, for instance, is going to say they openly oppose motherhood? Who's

going to confess to being unbalanced? So, who would wish to be seen to be

advocating an unbalanced scorecard, rather than a balanced one?

"The Balanced Scorecard" is a great marketing term, of course, but, arguably, reflects sloppy underlying thinking.

My suggestion is that the time has come for those of us with a special interest in performance measurement to put notions of 'balance' behind us.

and start to talk about a genuinely "systemic" perspective on performance instead.

OK, I recognise this would require us to explore what is implied by a 'genuinely systemic scorecard', but at least we could put fruitless notions

of 'balance' behind us.

I recognise this is potentially a controversial point-of-view, and, indeed

I may be one of only a limited number of people who happen to think this

way, so I'd really welcome comments from the Forum at large on this topic.
